<b>RIGHTS OF WAY</b>					
1. The PC ask the Parish Path Warden (PPW) to confirm the finding of the audit. See Appendix D For paths that need action.					
2. Council receives annual report on state of footpaths from PPW.					
3. The landowners and County Council are requested by the PC to improve the standard of the existing paths in line with the attached audit.					
4. A small booklet / flier should be produced with a map and description of the various paths and suggested round trip walks.					
5. Encourage walkers finding problems to report them to the Parish Clerk for action.					
6. PC to formally approve desirability of all weather fully accessible route to Thrapston - Stanwick lakes track (disused railway line).					

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8. PC to work with County Footpaths Officer team to cost and prepare bid under Natural England P4C which has been set up to improve the public rights of way and access to the countryside.					
9. Liaise with both landowners to gain outline support for project					
<b>HIGHWAYS and TRAFFIC</b>					
10. Install a new school road sign 50 yards south from the school in the west verge near the phone box.					
11. Install SLOW SCHOOL road markings on approach to school and . Install SLOW at approach to the bend into the village at the south end of the Green.					
12. PC to install electronic speed advice sign on High St. and consider purchasing mobile speed warning sign instead of fixed as recommended by NCC (MGWSP) liaison officer.					

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13. Construct gateway feature with new Woodford sign and create narrowing in road markings to slow traffic at each entrance to village.					
14. Create 30 mph roundels and SLOW in road markings on carriageway at entrances to village and at other locations.					
<b>COMMUNICATIONS</b>					
15. Purchase at least one new noticeboard, to be situated in an accessible place, and to encourage local organisations to use it to advertise their activities and events					
16. Produce 'Woodford Matters' , a booklet containing contact details and information about the local facilities and organisations in the village, grouped by different ages and interests					
17. Produce 'What's on in Woodford', a calendar of all events in the village, and encourage local organisations to contribute to this.					
18. Produce 'Welcome to Woodford', a pack to include any information a new resident would need to know about the village					

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<b>THE VILLAGE ENVIRONMEMENT</b>					
19. The provision of litter bins will be reviewed at the request of residents.					
20. A twice-yearly 'clear-up' event will be arranged, with the help of village volunteers.					
21. Residents will be asked to report fly-tipping incidents to ENC on 01832 742026.					
22. Five extra dog bins will be provided, at the locations requested by residents.					
23. The relevant bodies to be approached for improvements to the prioritised pavements (shown on map)					
24. The relevant bodies to be approached to request provision of hard & soft landscaping to the area on the west side of the Green.					
25. P.C. to be approached for funding for 'clear-up' equipment.					
26. P.C. to be requested to liaise with ENC to provide additional dog bins.

27. Continue to listen to the voices and opinions of the villagers					
28. Optimise facilities that already exist within the village
