



Woodford Remembers



William Walter Tiney

1880 - 23 July 1916

Family

William Walter (order of names varies) was born to Frederick and Jane Tiney of Woodford in early 1880. He was christened at St Marys Church on 5 April 1880. His elder siblings were Amos, Thomas, Harriett, and a younger sister Elizabeth. Soon after William's birth the family had fallen on hard times and were living in the Thrapston Workhouse but by the time of the 1891 census the family had returned to Woodford and were living in Church Street.

In 1901 William aged 21 was living in Mill Terrace with his sister Harriett and brother in law Herbert.

On 29 December 1908 he married Ethel Reeve, a widow, and by 1911 he lived in Woodwell with his children Kathleen and Annie and stepchildren Benjamin and Dorothy.

Army Service

William Walter enlisted in Kettering 16510 into the Northamptonshire Regiment on 23 November 1914 and gave his home address as Bournville Great Addington, and his next of kin as Ethel Tiney of Ivy Cottage Great Addington. He initially was with the 3rd Battalion before being posted to France with the 2nd Battalion on 6 March 1915 where he sustained a gunshot wound to his shoulder. He recuperated in Litchfield and he rejoined his regiment in 10 April 1915. He was posted back to France in November 2015. He was killed in action on 23 July 1916 during the Somme offensive.

His next of kin were notified on 15 August that year. It was not until 20 February of the following year that with effect of 19 February was his widow awarded 23/-per week for herself and "three orphans"
